HOW CAN WE KEEP FROM BEING OVERCOME BY THE ENEMY'S ATTACKS? PART 3: DEALING WITH THREATS FROM WITHIN Nehemiah 5:1-19

- I. IN DIRE CIRCUMSTANCES IT IS OK CRY OUT AMONG THE BODY ABOUT SO-CALLED BROTHERS WHO ARE PUBLICLY SINNING AGAINST YOU: The people who were being sinned against cried out concerning their Jewish brothers' sinful usury and subsequent enslavement (1-5)
- II. REALIZE GODLY LEADERSHIP WILL CONFRONT THESE SITUATIONS: Nehemiah responds to their outcry by wisely contending with those nobles and rulers in sin (6-11)
 - A. Nehemiah had a righteous anger concerning their outcry (6)
 - **B.** Nehemiah first wisely thought it over before confronting the nobles and rulers (7a)
 - C. Nehemiah contended with the nobles and rulers, wisely rebuking them publicly in accordance with God's Word (7b-11)
 - 1. He first exposed the issue: Contrary to God's Word they were exacting usury upon their brethren (7a)
 - 2. He then held a great assembly against them, wisely confronting, identifying himself with what was right and then exposed their wrong (7b-11)
 - a) Nehemiah reveals while he was redeeming his brethren, these through usury were enslaving them; this was not good revealing a lack of fear of the Lord, also bringing the nation's reproach (8-9)
 - b) Nehemiah wisely calls upon them to leave of their usury and give back their property and interest that was exacted from them (10-11)
- III. PRAISE GOD FOR THEIR RESPONSE: The said they would obey, gave an oath, praised the Lord and did it (12-13)
- IV. REMEMBER, DOING GOOD TO HIS PEOPLE BECAUSE YOU FEAR HIM IS A FOUNDATION FOR FURTHER GOOD: Because Nehemiah feared the Lord, he did good and did not lay burdens or domineer the people, but instead was in a position to do even more good by confronting the brethren who were doing so (14-19)
